


















Collaborative Approaches to Public Safety

- The NRRC provides individualized, intensive, and targeted technical assistance training and distance learning to support SCA grantees.





Focus on Young Fathers



- STRENGTHENING THE ROLE OF COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS IN THE ECONOMIC RECOVERY
- REDUCING UNINTENDED PREGNANCIES, SUPPORTING MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH, AND REDUCING THE NEED FOR ABORTION
- PROMOTING RESPONSIBLE FATHERHOOD AND STRONG COMMUNITIES
- PROMOTING INTERFAITH DIALOGUE AND COOPERATION



Purpose of the Grant Program

Reduce recidivism among young fathers

Improve outcomes for young fathers, their children, and family members

Promote responsible fatherhood



- Target Population
 - Moderate to high risk of reoffending*
 - Held in a secure confinement facility at the time of enrollment
 - ▶ Enrolled prior to 25th birthday



Providing mentoring programs for young fathers

- Providing targeted transitional and reentry services that focus on
 - ▶ A comprehensive range of services for young fathers
 - Addressing needs that affect recidivism
 - Providing sustained case planning/management in the community
 - Providing adequate staff training



- Collect robust performance measures of implementation and impact
 - Tracking outcomes
 - Setting targets
 - Baseline recidivism rate & tracking recidivism



Planning Phase

- **\$50,000**
- ▶ Up to 12 months
- Complete Planning and Implementation (P&I) Guide

Implementation Phase

- Remaining funds available
- Implement plans details in P&I Guide



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


